#### **SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures**

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

Immediately remove contaminated clothing. If the patient is likely to become unconscious, place and transport in stable sideways position (recovery position). First aid personnel should pay attention to their own safety.

If inhaled:

Keep patient calm, remove to fresh air, seek medical attention.

On skin contact:

Immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, seek medical attention.

Wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open.

Immediately rinse mouth and then drink 200-300 ml of water, seek medical attention. Administer 50 ml of pure ethanol in a drinkable concentration.
